Matters arising</p>	<p><u>Update on Attendance Matters Proposal- subgroup</u></p> <p>KS noted the recent Cluster Head Teacher meeting that took place where the proposal was discussed in a positive light. KS also highlighted the Learning Community Meeting on the 9th, which Attendance Achievement subgroup members are invited to attend.</p> <p>KS pointed out there is a possibility the launch of the Attendance Matters campaign would be delayed, and may need to move from January to later in the year. Musselburgh Well-being</p>	<p><u>Support from the Start</u></p> <p>SS explained the role of Support from the Start in facilitating and enabling mainstream services to deliver support in a different and more effective way in response to community identified needs and strengths. The initiative focuses on the early years; pre-birth-8, and brings together a number of professionals and includes lots of participation from community groups and parents.</p> <p>SS explained Support from the Start have been revising their short and long-term action plans, and encouraged the Area Partnership to read and comment on their updated Musselburgh Action Plan.</p> <p>The 2014 ‘Support from the Start’ Action Plan is available at http://www.eastlothian.gov.uk/downloads/file/7090/musselburgh_action_plan_2014</p> <p>SS asked the Partnership if they would like to see a representative from Support from the Start deliver a briefing session at a future meeting to update them on initiatives occurring in the Musselburgh Community.</p>	<p>Action: Staff- to investigate Support from the Start input at a future meeting</p>
	<p><u>SHANARRI Checklist</u></p> <p>SS explained that under the Children and Young People’s Act, there is now a new statutory duty to look at well-being in a broader sense, and as such, a set of well-being indicators have been established encompassing; Safe, Healthy, Achieving, Nurtured, Active, Respected, Responsible and Included - SHANARRI.</p> <p>SS encouraged the Area Partnership to look at all of these indicators and consider what their aspirations are for improvements in each of these areas.</p> <p>An integrated Children’s Services Plan will look to deliver on these outcomes and indicators and strive to improve the outcomes for children in East Lothian.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • SC expressed concern over the figure that ¼ of children in Musselburgh are living in poverty and noted it would be also critical to look at how this can be tackled. <p>The discussions and feedback from the brainstorming task can be found in Appendix 1.1.</p>	

<p>5. Formulating the Draft Area Plan</p>	<p>KS distributed a very early first draft of the Musselburgh Area Plan which, to date, pulls together themes and conversations from all previous Partnership meetings.</p> <p>KS pointed out each of the themes and actions put forward so far have been grouped under the 3 Single Outcome Strategic Themes.</p> <p>KS posed the question to the Area Partnership: Do these priority areas/actions fit with what you have been discussing? She encouraged attendees of the meeting to read through the draft Area Plan and provide feedback and comments.</p> <p>A copy – along with the suggested changes made by the Area Partnership at the meeting - is attached with these minutes.</p> <p>SS noted the importance of the Area Partnership continuing to contribute ongoing suggestions for amendments, additions and proposals to make improvements.
