SUBJECT:	Position Statement on Section 10 Grant funded Services – Adult Services

1. PURPOSE

1.1 This report is to inform the Integration Joint Board of the current position with regard to Section 10 grant awards within Adult Services and the proposed way forward for 2017/18.

2. RECOMMENDATIONS

The IJB is asked to:

2.1 Approve continuation of current Section 10 Grants for the 12 months from April 2017 to March 2018 noting the commitment to complete the review of all grant funding within that year.

2.2 Note that a number of reviews have taken place and further reviews on the remaining services will continue beyond April 2017 in order to have a complete picture of community provision in preparation for the development of a new community framework to be in place by April 2018.

2.3 Note that a proportion of Section 10 funding has been made available and a decision will be made on the use of this funding once the budget position for 2017/18 is confirmed.

2.4 Note the progress made against the key recommendations from the internal audit of Section 10 Grant funded services.

3. BACKGROUND

3.1 East Lothian Health and Social Care Partnership, via Adult services, funds a

range of providers across health and social care through formal contractual arrangements. These range from nationally agreed frameworks to locally remodelled services to obtain Best Value, promote service user choice and reflect changes towards personalised services and this includes a range of Section 10 grant funded services.

3.2 The IJB asked East Lothian Council to review Section Grants during 2016/17. During the past 12 months a number of reviews of Section 10 grant funded services have been completed with further reviews currently underway. These reviews have led to the ceasing of a small number of projects and the need to continue funding of the remaining services for a further 12 months. Any changes have been agreed with the organisations involved.

3.3 Alongside these reviews two projects have been running which have re-modelled specialist support and care at home services and older people's day care provision, with both re-modelled service areas to be in place by April 2017.

3.4 As part of these projects it has been agreed that a review of all community provision will be needed in 2017 to effectively support the new care at home and older peoples' day care provision and to ensure priorities within the Strategic Plan are met. Completion of the review of Section 10 grant funded services will form part of this overall community provision review.

3.5 Current Section 10 funding has been subject to internal audit within East Lothian Council and key gaps, priorities for action and recommendations for improvement have been progressed which include:

- A proposed bidding process with supporting documentation and agreeing and approving all decisions on funding and disinvestment including Section 10 grant awards being made at the monthly East Lothian Health & Social Care Procurement Board.
- Section 10 Grant awarding now part of annual corporate reporting process registered as a Members' Library Report.
- A structured reviewing schedule now in place with supporting documentation.
