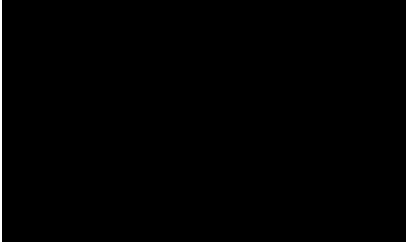

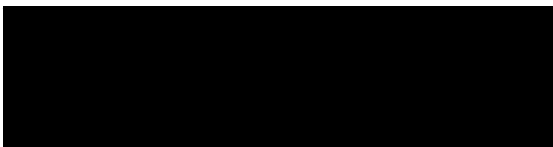

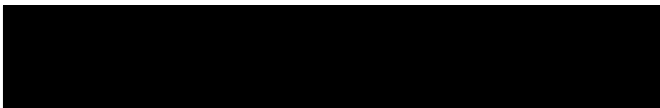
During the four years I have lived here, I have not experienced any noise problems, either from the event venue or from guests entering or leaving the venue.

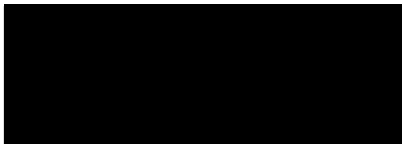

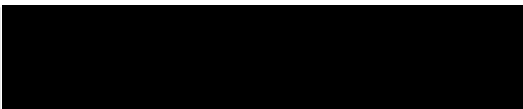


Dear Sir/Madame
